

Quick Start Guide

Introduction

This guide provides a simple, organized system for taking meaningful notes in your Bible. Using a combination of color coding, margin symbols, and a notebook reference system, you can deepen your understanding of Scripture and easily track insights over time.

Part 1: Color Coding System

Use these colors to mark different theological themes in your Bible:

- Green Creation and the Natural World
 - Mark verses about creation, nature, and God's physical world.
- Red Christ and Redemption
 - Use for references to Jesus, His sacrifice, salvation, and the cross.
- Blue Church and Community
 - Highlight passages about baptism, the body of believers, and fellowship.
- Orange Holy Spirit
 - o Mark verses about the Spirit's work, guidance, and gifts.
- Yellow Promises and Blessings
 - o Use for God's promises, covenant blessings, and provisions.
- Purple Eschatology (End Times)
 - o Mark passages about Christ's return, heaven, and final judgment.
- ✓ **Tip:** Start with **2-3 colors** until you become comfortable with the system.

Part 2: Margin Symbols

Use these simple symbols in your Bible margins to quickly identify key concepts:

- ♥ Love (God's love, loving others)
- 🙏 Prayer & Worship

- 11 Atonement & Salvation
- ↑ **Resurrection** (Jesus' resurrection & our future hope)
- Z Reference to Notebook Entry (For deeper notes)

Example:

If you mark John 3:16, you could write:

- lacktriangle (Christ/Redemption) + lacktriangle (Love) + lacktriangle (Salvation)
- ✓ **Tip:** Keep your markings **consistent** throughout your Bible study.

Part 3: Notebook Reference System

Materials Needed:

- ✓ A dedicated notebook
- ✓ Your Bible
- ✓ Pens that won't bleed through Bible pages

Setting Up Your Notebook:

- 1 Reserve the first 5 pages for a Table of Contents.
- 2 Begin your notes on page 6.
- 3 For each entry:
 - Number it sequentially (N001, N002, N003, etc.).
 - Include the **Bible reference** (e.g., **John 3:16**).
 - Add a brief topic title (e.g., "God's Love").
 - Write your insights, key themes, cross-references, and applications.
- ✓ Tip: Date your entries to track your study progress.

Using the System

- ✓ Step 1: Identify important passages while reading your Bible.
- **▼ Step 2:** Write the note reference (e.g., "**N001**") in the Bible's margin.
- ✓ Step 3: In your notebook, create an entry with:
 - Entry Number (e.g., N001)
 - Bible Reference (e.g., John 3:16)
 - Title (e.g., "God's Love")
 - Your complete notes, insights, and cross-references
 - **Step 4:** Update your **Table of Contents** for quick reference later.

📌 Practical Example:

You're studying John 3:16 and want to take notes.

- 🚺 In your Bible:
 - Highlight John 3:16 in red (Christ/Redemption).

- Write "N001" in the margin.
 - 2 In your Notebook:
- N001 John 3:16 God's Love
- Write:
 - o "God's love is the foundation of salvation."
 - o "Cross-reference: Romans 5:8, 1 John 4:9."
 - o "Application: Am I reflecting this love in my daily life?"
 - 3 In your Table of Contents:
- N001 John 3:16 God's Love
- ✓ Tip: Consider using a wide-margin or journaling Bible for extra space.

Important Tips

- ◆ Test your pens first on a blank Bible page to avoid bleed-through.
- Start with **just a few colors** and expand as you get comfortable.
- Be consistent with symbols and colors across your study.
- Review your notes regularly to reinforce learning.
- Adapt the system to your personal study preferences!
- This system is designed to grow with your Bible study practice. Start simple, stay consistent, and watch your understanding of Scripture deepen!
